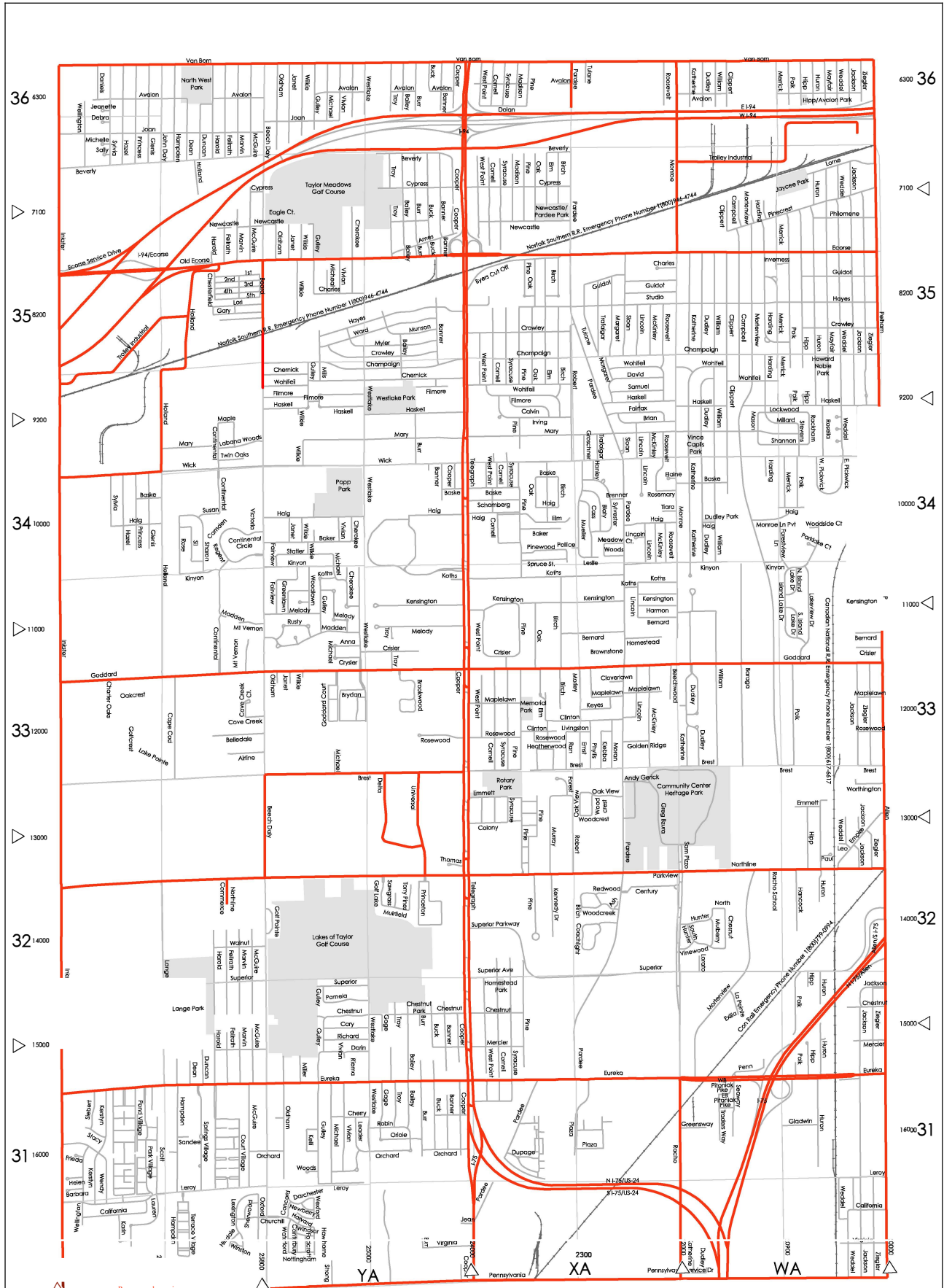

This map displays the **official truck route network for the City of Taylor, Michigan (2025 update)**. The base map shows city streets, parcels, and buildings in light gray, while **designated truck routes are highlighted in red**.

The routes form a network primarily along **major arterial roads and highway connectors** that allow commercial truck traffic to travel across the city while minimizing use of residential streets.

A prominent **north–south truck corridor runs through the center of the city**, intersecting with multiple **east–west truck routes**. These east–west routes connect industrial areas and commercial corridors.

In the **southeastern portion of the map**, truck routes connect to a large highway interchange where multiple ramps converge. Curved red lines represent the highway ramps and connector roads that allow trucks to access the regional freeway system.

Additional truck routes appear along the **northern edge of the city**, providing connections between industrial areas and major regional roads.

Residential neighborhoods, buildings, and local streets are shown but are not designated truck routes. The red route lines indicate streets where trucks are permitted or encouraged to travel.
